COOL CROP VEGETABLES* (2020)
Available Early March
& Mid-August

(*Information is general as many things can affect garden performance.)

Broccoli

Castle Dome Hybrid – 60 days; early; uniform heads; good heat and cold tolerance

Green Magic F1 – 90 days; Good for warmer areas; widely adaptable

Brussels Sprouts

Jade Cross E F1 – 90 days; produces firm, closely packed sprouts; easy to pick

Cabbage

Emerald Cross – 45-50 days; medium round heads; 2 ½ to 3 lbs; garden favorite

Flat Dutch (Early) – 85 days; 12 – 15 lb. heads; very solid; great for kraut

Stonehead F1 – 55 days; 2 lb. small round heads store well; popular variety

Cauliflower

Snow Crown F1 – 55 days; vigorous grower; excellent for fresh/frozen use

Kale

Starbor F1 – 50 days; very curly, flavorful, dark blue-green leaves that can be harvested at once or stripped off individually; heavy producer; compact habit

Lettuce

Buttercrunch – 28-46 days; can be harvested as baby leaves up to maturity; produces tightly bunched 6" rosettes of crisp sweet leaves

Spinach

Avon F1 – 25-44 days; large, crinkled dark green leaves with intense flavor; fast growing; bolt tolerant; good disease resistance; harvest as baby leaves up to maturity

EGGPLANT & PEPPERS* (2020)

Available Early April

(*Information is general as many things can affect garden performance.)

Eggplant (don't overwater; mulching plant is recommended; eggplants are heavy feeders)

Black Beauty – 74 - 82 days; very popular heirloom variety with oval egg-shaped purple fruit; good producer

Millionaire Hybrid – 60-70 days; popular oriental variety excellent for stir fry; slender fruits with dark purple skin; widely adaptable

Peppers (Sweet)

Banana – 65 days; produces up to 8" long sweet fruit

Pimento – 75 days; produces sweet, thick walled fruit

Peppers (Bell) (*all colored bells start out green and ripen to their respective colors)

Better Belle III – 65-70 days; blocky, thick walled fruit; patio variety **Only available in 4" pots**

Big Bertha F1 – 73 days; large 3-4 lobed thick walled green/red fruit; tobacco mosaic resistant

California Wonder – 75 days; medium green/red blocky fruit; good for stuffing

Golden California Wonder* – 62-73 days; medium sized fruit; good for stuffing

Keystone – 75-80 days; large, blocky green to red fruit; good disease resistance

Mardi Gras Fun – 65-80 days; come in red/yellow/purple/orange snack size fruit; patio variety. **Only available in 4" pots**

Orange Blaze* F1 - 65-70 days; 3-4" long fruit with 2-3 lobes that mature to intense orange; good disease resistance; 2011 AAS winner. **Only available in 4" pots**

Purple Bell* – 74 days; has medium, blocky, thick walled fruit

Yolo Wonder (Red Bell)* – 70-75 days; prolific bearer of sweet, thick walled fruit; tobacco mosaic tolerant

Peppers (Hot)

Anaheim Chile – 76 days; heavy yields of 5" long hot peppers; often used green; vigorous and hardy

Banana – 65-70 days; early 5" long yellow fruit with thick walls; medium hot; good for frying, roasting

Bhut Jolokia (Ghost Pepper) – 100 days; 2.5 – 3" long superhot Indian chili pepper; **use caution when harvesting and handling the mature fruits**

Cayenne – 70 to 75 days; 4 – 6" long, red, thin walled fruit; very hot

Habañero – 95-100 days; small light green/orange fruits; one of the hottest; thin walls wrinkle when mature

Jalapeno – 75-80 days; thick walled fruits that are flavorful with some heat

Poblano (known as Ancho when dried) – 65 to 75 days; 4" heart-shaped fruit ripen to deep red; fruit picked red is much hotter than if picked green; one of most popular chili peppers in Mexico

Serrano – 85-90 days; looks similar to a jalapeno but much hotter

TOMATILLO & TOMATOES* (2020)
Available Early April

Tomatillo

Super Verde – 70-75 days; prolific bearer of 2 ½ oz. fruits; green when ripe encased with papery husks; used in authentic salsa and southwestern cooking; adaptable to different conditions; good shelf life

Tomatoes: Determinate varieties have shorter harvest times but usually heavier harvests; caged plants do best. Indeterminate varieties bear over an extended time; better if staked or caged.

Beefmaster F1 – 81 days; indeterminate; 12 – 16 oz. fruit; reports of 2 lb. fruit; one of largest beefsteak types

Best Boy Bush – 75 days; indeterminate; 8-11 oz fruit; 3' tall plant good for ground or containers. **Only available in 4" pots**

Better Boy F1 – 75 days; indeterminate; 8 oz. red fruit; most popular; extremely high yields; excellent flavor; excellent slicer and good for canning

Big Beef F1 – 70 days; indeterminate; 10 – 12 oz. round fruit; heavy producer; one of the best beefsteaks

Big Boy (Burpee) F1 – 78 days; indeterminate; 8 – 9 oz. fruit; vigorous; popular variety for home gardeners; great taste and good for canning

Black Cherry – 65 days; indeterminate; clusters of 1" round purple-red fruits; popular heirloom; sweet and juicy; good for salads and eating off the vine

Black Krim – 80 days; indeterminate; medium, sweet, dark red-purple beefsteak; heirloom from Russia

Bradley – 80 days; semi-indeterminate; 10 oz. pink fruit; great for canning; excellent for the south; old fashioned heirloom

Brandywine Yellow – 90 days; indeterminate; large 1-2 lb. yellow fruit; heirloom variety with potato leaf; great flavor

Bush Champion – 65 days; determinate; 9 – 12 oz fruit; ideal for canning or eating; patio variety. **Only available in 4" pots**

Celebrity F1 – 72 days; determinate; 7 – 8 oz. round fruit; great taste and vigorous; good canner

Cherokee Purple – 80 days; indeterminate; large beefsteak; heirloom known for dark color and flavor

Early Girl F1 – 60 days; indeterminate; 4 – 6 oz. fruit; early slicing variety; produces for an extended time; great taste

Early Girl Bush F1 – 55-65 days; determinate; 6-8 oz. fruits; patio variety; ideal for salsa, salads, and eating. **Only available in 4" pots**

German Pink – 80 days; indeterminate; large 1 – 2 lb. pink fruit; meaty and sweet; renowned for flavor; popular heirloom; potato leaf

Golden Jubilee – 80 days; indeterminate; 8 oz. golden fruit; meaty fruit with low acid; heirloom

Goliath F1 – 65 days; indeterminate; 1 – 3 lb. sweet red fruit; one of best early giants

Jet Star F1 – 75 days; indeterminate; 6 – 8 oz. fruit; high yielding; tasty red fruit; excellent for canning and eating

Juliet F1 – 60 days; indeterminate; cluster grower with up to 18 small grape type fruits per cluster; stores well; less cracking; good disease resistance

Lemon Boy F1 – 72 days; indeterminate; 7 oz. fruit; unique lemon color and good flavor; good slicer

Mortgage Lifter – 80 days; indeterminate; huge fruit (up to 4 lbs.); heirloom beefsteak; good slicer with fewer seeds

Mountain Fresh F1 – 75 days; determinate; 8 – 16 oz. red fruit perfect for slicing; good disease resistance; bred for Southeast; excellent taste

Mountain Pride F1 – 77 days; determinate; large firm red fruit known for flavor; ideal for home or commercial use; good slicer and canner

Mr. Stripey – 80 days; indeterminate; well-known heirloom from Virginia; large red fruit with orange yellow stripes; low acid and good slicer

Rapunzel – 68 to 70 days; indeterminate; long trusses containing up to 40 small red tomatoes; very sweet

Red Grape F1 – 65 days/indeterminate; clusters of 12-16 grape-sized tomatoes; disease resistant; heavy yielder; firm and sweet bright red fruits. **Only available in 4" pots**

Roma – 78 days; determinate; 2 oz. plum-shaped fruit; excellent for pastes and sauces

Rutgers – 82 days; determinate; old popular heirloom; medium sized 5 oz. fruits; tart taste; good canner

Sunsugar F1 – 62 days; indeterminate; small yellow-orange bite-size fruits all summer; very sweet; good crack resistance

Supersweet 100s F1 – 65 days; indeterminate; bears many clusters of small cherry tomatoes; great for eating

Totem – 70 days; determinate; produces lots of 2" fruits; patio variety. **Only available in 4" pots**

Whopper (Parks) F1 – 65 days; indeterminate; big red fruit excellent for eating; popular with home gardeners; good canner

Yellow Pear – 70 to 75 days; indeterminate; long abundant clusters of yellow pear-shaped fruit all summer; heirloom

Cucumbers, Melons, Okra & Squash* (2020) Available mid-April

(*Information is general as many things can affect garden performance.)

Cantaloupe

Ambrosia F1 – 86 days; extra sweet muskmelon type without ribs; 4 lb. fruit

Burpee Hybrid F1 – 82 days; popular and favorite variety; 4 – 5 lb. fruit; very tasty

Hale's Best – 80 days; popular heirloom; 3 – 4 lb. fruit; good for southeast gardens

Sugar Cube F1 – 81 days; each plant produces multiple 4" (2 lb.) fruits; very sweet; good disease resistance and shelf life

Cucumber

Burpless #26 F1 – 60 days; compact and highly productive; 9 – 10" fruit; great slicer; one of most popular

Burpless Bush F1 – 60 days; dark green fruit; best when picked 8 – 10" long; good slicer

Bush Pickle – 54 days; 4 – 5" fruit on compact plants

Homemade Pickles – 65 days; bush type plants have medium green fruit; can harvest 1.5" for baby sweets

Okra

Clemson Spineless – 56 days; popular and reliable variety for this area; plants grow 4 – 6' tall; best when picked 3 – 4" long

Squash

Yellow Crookneck (Dixie F1) – 41 days; shiny, lemon yellow fruit; best when picked 5-6" long; high yields and vigorous plants

Yellow Straightneck – 55 days; fruit 10 – 14" long

Zucchini

Ball's Zucchini II – 48-50 days; glossy green fruit; best picked when 7-8"; heavy producer

Dark Green – 45-65 days; vigorous grower; produces lots of dark green mottled fruits

Spineless Beauty F1 – 43 days; medium green fruit; best when picked 4 – 8" long (*limited availability*)

Watermelon

Crimson Sweet – 90 days; striped oval 15 – 25 lb. fruit; sweet, deep red fruit

Moon & Stars – 100 days; late heirloom variety with dark green fruit with yellow spots; large, very sweet fruit

Sugar Baby – 80 days; heirloom variety; 8 – 10 lb. fruit; dark green with sweet red flesh
